

## 2023-2024 In Review: Policy Wins for Military Families

## 2025 Defense Spending Bill (NDAA) (in addition to the Quality of Life Panel recommendations):

- Authorized \$50 million in DoD Impact Aid for local school districts serving large numbers of military-connected children, and an additional \$20 million for schools serving military children with special needs.
- Establishes a perinatal mental health pilot program at select Military Treatment Facilities (MTFs).
- Eliminates co-pays for contraceptives.
- License portability for behavioral health providers serving military families.

## 2024 Defense Spending Bill

- Increase in Family Separation Allowance from \$250 to \$400 per month.
- Extension of Commissary and Exchange privileges to remarried surviving spouses.
- License portability for Military Family Life Counselors (MFLCs), behavioral health providers who contract with DoD to provide non-medical counseling services in a variety of settings. This makes it easier for MFLCs to serve at multiple installations.
- Coverage of hearing aids for retirees' children.
- Student loan deferment for dislocated military spouses.

## Key Priorities from Secretary Austin's Taking Care of People initiative:

- Established health care and dependent care savings accounts for service members.
- Expansion of My Career Advancement Account eligibility to spouses in all enlisted ranks.
- Universal pre-K at Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) schools.
- Increase Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE) coverage from 14 to 21 days.
